

KYUEM Policy on Student Absence and Public Examinations

KYUEM is a Cambridge Fellowship Centre – we specifically offer Cambridge International Examinations at AS and A-level.

In order to maintain a high level of success in both these public examinations, a minimum percentage of attendance is required. This ensures the content of the curriculum is fully covered. If a student attends for less than 70% of the allotted time, there is no way in which s/he can realistically expect to attain a satisfactory grade.

KYUEM attendance policy is, therefore, that anyone who misses 30% or more of a given curriculum, should not be allowed to sit for a Cambridge International Examinations.

KYUEM Policy on Students Requiring Remedial Assistance

KYUEM monitors student progress throughout their college career via a sophisticated Student Management System (SMS) known as QIAB. The QIAB platform records attendance in every lesson, continuous assessment of homework and assigned tasks, health, discipline, ECA and many other features.

A major part of the KY programme concerns tracking of academic progress. Whenever progress is deemed to be inadequate for the level of the student concerned, the system flags it and action is taken. In the case of remedial academic assistance, this may take the form of specialist classes conducted by KYUEM teaching staff.

Additional academic help is also made available via a student-led peer tutoring system, which is not recorded on QIAB, but on a case-by-case basis and with the full compliance and knowledge of the academic monitoring staff.
